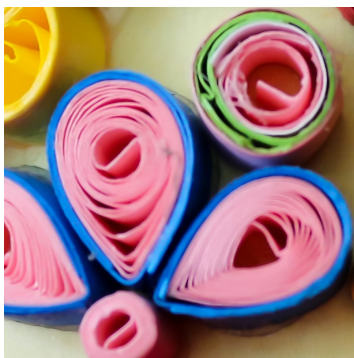

Heritage Property Designations

Shortly Heritage Services will recommend adding over 500 properties to the Heritage Register as non-designated listings.
